Hibiscus palustris  
**SWAMP ROSE MALLOW**



Native wildflower

Blooms: Early to late August  
 Leaves: Alternate, oval, toothed, 6 to 8 inches long, pointed tip  
 Height: 3 to 7 feet  
 Habitat: Wet prairies and marshes  
 Swamp rose mallow has large, four to six inch wide, showy pink flowers on a tall, seven-foot plant. It is very hard to mess when it is blooming in late summer.

**HAIRY PUCCOON**

Wildflower



Native wildflower

Blooms: Late April to early October  
 Leaves: Alternate, 1 1/2 inches, lance-shaped, stemless, hairy  
 Height: Up to 1 foot  
 Habitat: Dunes, black oak savannas  
 Puccoon is an American Indian word for plants that produce eyes. This beautiful and common fore-dune plant is at its peak in late spring.
